DECISION OF THE BOARD:

1. This is an application for accreditation. The applicant and the respondent Local Union are parties to an agreement dated May 1, 1971, and in effect until April 30, 1973. That agreement is an agreement between the applicant and five Locals, one of which is the respondent Local in the present application. This agreement was in effect at the time when this application was made and the Board therefore finds that it has the jurisdiction under section 113 of the Act to entertain this application.

2. The applicant employers' organization is an association whose constitution was revised in September 1971. Prior to 1971 the applicant association had been known as The Structural Steel Erection Contractors Association of Ontario and under that name had engaged in collective bargaining for a number of years. The revision of the constitution in 1971 gave the applicant association the specific objects of:

(b) To act as bargaining agent for its members in negotiating and entering into collective bargaining agreements with The International Association of Bridge, Structural and Ornamental Ironworkers and the International Union of Operating Engineers (Hoisting Division) or any Local Union of either, covering those employees of the members of the Association who are engaged in work at construction sites in Ontario.

(c) To become an accredited employers' organization under The Labour Relations Act and to regulate the relations between employer members and employees in the construction industry and to represent such employer members in collective bargaining within any sector of the construction industry in any geographical area, as defined in The Labour Relations Act.

On the basis of the evidence before it the Board finds that the applicant is an employers' organization within the meaning of section 106(d) of the Act, and further that it is a properly constituted organization for the purposes of section 115(3) of the Act.

3. The applicant filed with the Board documentary evidence of representation on behalf of 181 employers. The evidence of representation is in two forms. For a number of employers the applicant has filed the documents by which an individual employer applies for membership in an applicant. The applicant also filed evidence of representation in the Form of Power of Attorney in which the individual employer appoints the applicant association as agent and representative for collective bargaining. The applicant also filed a duly completed Form 62, Declaration Concerning Representation Documents. The Board therefore further finds that the applicant has submitted acceptable documentary evidence of representation on behalf of 181 employers.

4. The collective agreement referred to in paragraph 1 provides in Article 3 for a number of territorial boundaries for the 6 Locals of The International Association of Bridge, Structural and Ornamental Ironworkers in the Province of Ontario. With respect to the respondent Local 736 the geographical area set out in Article 3.1 of the agreement is:

"All of the counties of Brant, Bruce, Gray, Haldimand, Huron, Lincoln, Norfolk, Oxford, Perth, Waterloo, Welland, Wellington, and Westworth, and all of the county of Halton - except for the premises of the Ford Motor Company."

The applicant has applied for a unit of employers which relates to the geographic area set out in the collective agreement pertaining to the respondent Local and in the industrial, commercial and institutional sector and in the heavy engineering sector. The various parties to the application have agreed that these two sectors are the appropriate sectors for accreditation in the present case. Accordingly, the Board further finds that all employers of ironworkers for whom the respondent has bargaining rights in the Counties of Brant, Bruce, Gray, Haldimand, Huron, Lincoln, Norfolk, Oxford, Perth, Waterloo, Welland, Wellington, and Westworth, and all of the County of Halton - except for the premises of the Ford Motor Company in the industrial, commercial and institutional and heavy engineering sector of the construction industry, constitute a unit of employers appropriate for collective bargaining.

5. For the purposes of clarity the Board further notes that the term ironworkers does not include rodmen.

6. After the hearing in this matter the Board appointed an Examiner to consult with the parties and receive their filings with respect to various individual

employers. The Examiner has reported to the Board and the parties have made no statement of objections and desire to make representations on the Report of the Examiner. The Examiner's Report contains the representations of the parties with respect to certain individual employers and it also refers to two exhibits in the form of letters filed with the Examiner. As a result of the Report of the Examiner the Board is now in a position to deal with all of the employers on the list of employers.

7. As a result of the filings of the applicant and the respondent the Board prepared a list of employers who might be affected by this application. The list consists of one hundred and eighty-nine (189) employers. In accordance with the Board's Rules of Procedure, each of these employers was served with notice of this application and under the Board's Rules of Procedure was required to file Form 68, Employer Filing, together with its Schedule "H".

8. It would appear that the Board has been unable to effect service on three employers at the address given by the applicant or the respondent. For instance, the registered letters sent by the Board to the employers were returned marked by the post office "moved" or "unknown". Accordingly, Employer No. 2 - ABC Steel Bldgs. Ltd., No. 45 - Crittall Fenestra Ltd. and No. 107 - Medway Metalwork Ltd., are removed from the list of employers in the unit of employers.

9. It would appear also that certain employers on the list of employers are duplications of other employers on the list. Thus, No. 32 - Calorific Construction is removed as a duplication of No. 40-4, Calorific Construction Limited; No. 40-13 - Grightmire Steel Construction Ltd. is removed as a duplication of No. 72, Grightmire Steel Ltd.; No. 40-22 - Naidanac Mechanical Ltd. is removed as a duplication of No. 115, Naidanac Mech. Ltd.

10. At the Examiner's meeting the parties agreed that Employer No. 98 - W.A. McDougall Ltd. is bankrupt and should be removed from the list of employers. Also, Employer No. 84 - Jensen Steel Ltd. should be removed from the list of employers not being in the construction industry.

11. However, the parties did challenge the filings of the remaining employers who claimed in their filings that the respondent does not have bargaining rights for their employees. In this regard exhibits were filed with the Examiner by the parties to show that the respondent has bargaining rights for the employees of the challenged employers. Thus, they are placed on Final Schedule "F":

12. The parties did not challenge the representation of three employers who claimed in their filings that the respondent does not have bargaining rights for their employees. Thus, No. 4 - Acadia Engineering & Fabricators, No. 88 - Kahkonen Construction Limited and No. 40-33 - Shokbeton Quebec Inc. are removed from the list.

13. A number of employers failed to file returns. In these circumstances the parties have agreed that the disposition of these employers for the purpose of section 115 of the Act is as follows:

The Board finds that the number of employers on Final Schedule "E" totalling ninety-three (93) is the number of employers to be ascertained by the Board under section 115(1)(a) of the Act.

15. On the basis of all the evidence before us the Board finds that on the date of the making of the application the applicant represented seventy (70) employers of the ninety-three (93) employers ascertained as the number of employers under section 115(1)(a) of the Act. The seventy (70) employers so represented is the number of employers to be ascertained by the Board under section 115(1)(b) of the Act. Accordingly, the Board is satisfied that a majority of the employers in the unit of employers are represented by the applicant.

16. The entitlement of an employers' organization to accreditation is based on a "double" majority. We have now dealt with the first of the majorities that an applicant must obtain, a majority of employers in the unit of employers. We now turn to determine whether those employers employed a majority of the employees affected

by this application. The Schedule "H" which accompanied the Form 68, Employer Filing, filed by the individual employers sets out the number of employees that the employer has at each job site with details of the location and the type of construction involved. By section 115(1)(c) of the Act the relevant payroll period is the weekly payroll period immediately preceding the making of the application, in this case the weekly payroll period immediately preceding June 15, 1972. The Board is satisfied that such a payroll period is the satisfactory payroll period for the determination in section 115(1)(c) of the Act.

17. On the basis of all the evidence before us and in accordance with the foregoing considerations the Board finds that there were eight hundred and eighty-seven (887) employees affected by the application during the weekly payroll period immediately preceding June 15, 1972. The eight hundred and eighty-seven (887) employees is the number of employees to be ascertained by the Board under section 115(1)(c) of the Act.

18. The Board further finds that the seventy (70) employers represented by the applicant employed eight hundred and one (801) of these eight hundred and eighty-seven (887) employees. The Board is therefore satisfied that the majority of the employers represented by the applicant employed a majority of employees as ascertained in accordance with the provisions of section 115(1)(c) of the Act.

19. Having regard to all of the above findings a Certificate of Accreditation will issue to the applicant for the unit of employers found to be an appropriate unit of employers in paragraph 5 and in accordance with the provisions of section 115(2) of the Act and for such other employers for whose employees the respondent may after June 15, 1972, obtain bargaining rights through certification or voluntary recognition in the geographic area and sector set out in the unit of employers.
