EMPLOYEE BARGAINING AGENCY DESIGNATION

Pursuant to clause g of subsection 1 of section 127 of The Labour Relations Act, R.S.O. 1970, c. 232, as amended, I hereby designate the United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipefitting Industry of the United States and Canada and the United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipefitting Industry of the United States and Canada, Local Union 853 as the employee bargaining agency to represent in bargaining all Journeymen and Apprentice Sprinkler Fitters, represented by the following affiliated bargaining agents:

1. United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipefitting Industry of the United States and Canada; or
2. Local Union 853 of the United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipefitting Industry of the United States and Canada; or
3. any other Local of the United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipefitting Industry of the United States and Canada which in the future may be chartered to represent Journeymen and Apprentice Sprinkler Fitters,

which Unions are hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Unions"), in the industrial, commercial and institutional sector of the construction industry in the Province of Ontario, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, bargaining as aforesaid in relation to bargaining rights of the Unions or any of them and the performance of work described in or covered by:

- (a) certificates of the Ontario Labour Relations Board granted to the Unions or any of them;
- (b) voluntary recognition agreements between the Unions or any of them and any employers;

- (c) collective agreements to which the Unions or any of them have been or are party to or bound by, covering the industrial, commercial and institutional sector of the construction industry in the Province of Ontario, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the collective agreement made between The Canadian Automatic Sprinkler Association and Local Union 853 of the United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipefitting Industry of the United States and Canada,

and such similar or other collective agreements to which the Unions or any of them are party to or bound by.
