EMPLOYEE BARGAINING AGENCY DESIGNATION

The designation of the International Union of Operating Engineers and Local 793 of the International Union of Operating Engineers dated March 31, 1978, is amended by substituting the word "employees" for the word "employers" in the twenty-fifth line thereof, so that the designation reads as follows:

Pursuant to clause <u>a</u> of subsection 1 of section 127 of The Labour Relations Act, R.S.O. 1970, c. 232, as amended, I hereby designate the International Union of Operating Engineers and Local 793 of the International Union of Operating Engineers as the employee bargaining agency to represent in bargaining all employees engaged in the operation of cranes, shovels, bulldozers or similar equipment, and those primarily engaged in the repairing or maintaining of same, and employees engaged as surveyors, represented by the following affiliated bargaining agents:

 The International Union of Operating Engineers; or

- 2. the following Local Unions: 793; or
- 3. any other Local of the International Union of Operating Engineers which may be chartered in future to represent employees engaged in the operation of cranes, shovels, bulldozers, or similar equipment, or those primarily engaged in the repairing or maintaining of same, or employees engaged as surveyors.

(which Unions are hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Unions"), in the industrial, commercial and institutional sector of the construction industry in the Province of Ontario, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, to represent in bargaining as aforesaid all employees bound by or parties to:

(a) certificates of the Ontario Labour Relations Board granted to the Unions or any of them;

(b) voluntary recognition agreements with the Unions or any of them;

(c) collective agreements to which the Unions or any of them have been or are party to or bound by, covering the industrial, commercial and institutional sector of the construction industry in the Province of Ontario.
