EMPLOYEE BARGAINING AGENCY DESIGNATION

The designation of the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association of the United States and Canada and the Ontario Provincial Conference of the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association of the United States and Canada dated April 27, 1978, is amended by adding the words "and spray fibre applicators, dry wall tapers and rigid insulation applicators" in the ninth and twenty-fourth lines thereof; so that the designation reads as follows:


Pursuant to clause a of subsection 1 of section 127 of The Labour Relations Act, R.S.O. 1970, c. 232 as amended, I hereby designate the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association of the United States and Canada and the Ontario Provincial Conference of the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association of the United States and Canada as the employee bargaining agency to represent in bargaining all Journeymen and Apprentice plasterers and spray fibre applicators, dry wall tapers and rigid insulation applicators represented by the following affiliated bargaining agents:

1. the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association of the United States and Canada; or
2. the Ontario Provincial Conference of the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association of the United States and Canada; or
3. the following Local Unions: 48, 159, 345, 915, 298, 124, 70, 162, 344; or
4. any other Local of the Operative Plasterers and Cement Masons International Association of the United States and Canada which, in the future, may be chartered to represent Journeymen and Apprentice plasterers and spray fibre applicators, dry wall tapers and rigid insulation applicators;

(which Conference and Unions are hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Unions"), in the industrial, commercial and institutional sector of the construction industry in

the Province of Ontario, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, to represent in bargaining as aforesaid all employees bound by or parties to:

- (a) certificates of the Ontario Labour Relations Board granted to the Unions or any of them;
- (b) voluntary recognition agreements with the Unions or any of them;
- (c) collective agreements to which the Unions or any of them have been or are party to or bound by, covering the industrial, commercial and institutional sector of the construction industry in the Province of Ontario
